TSAWWASSEN FIRST NATION LEGISLATURE RESUMES

TSAWWASSEN, B.C. – The fall session of the Tsawwassen Legislature began yesterday, November 4th, and will continue throughout November. The Legislature is the senior governing body of Canada’s first modern urban treaty First Nation government.

“We are seeing major progress on the ground within our Nation,” said Chief Bryce Williams. “2014 has been a very busy and positive year for growth in our community. In this session we will be considering a range of matters, including items that will help to promote our culture and preserve our connections to our lands. I am very much looking forward to starting this session and hearing Legislators’ perspectives on our progress at TFN, and what we can do better to advance our community.”

This year has seen Tsawwassen First Nation achieve major milestones in the development of a strong and sustainable economy. This included the signing of leases and beginning of construction on the Tsawwassen Mills and Tsawwassen Commons commercial retail projects; the start of construction of our new state-of-the-art sewer treatment plant; and the launch of three major developments at the Tsawwassen Gateway Logistics Centre. TFN also signed a financing Agreement with Vancity to assist in building critical infrastructure, and new residents are moving into the new residential community on TFN Lands.

The Fall 2014 Legislature will meet November 4, 6, 12, 18 & 20.
